Lieutenant General, USA (ret.) Nadja Y. West



Nadja West is a retired U.S. Army lieutenant general and the 44th U.S. Army Surgeon General and former Commanding General of the U.S. Army Medical Command. She is the first Black female lieutenant general in the U.S. Army and the highest-ranking woman to graduate from the U.S. Military Academy. She and her husband, retired U.S. Army Colonel Don West, reside near Washington, DC.

Senior Enlisted Advisor to the Chairman (ret.) John Wayne Troxell



SEAC(R) John Wayne Troxell served as the Senior Enlisted Advisor to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and the most senior noncommissioned officer in the U.S. Armed Forces, from December 11, 2015, until his retirement on December 13, 2019. In this role, he served as the principal military advisor to the Chairman and the Secretary of Defense on all matters involving joint and combined total force integration, utilization, the health of the force, and joint development for enlisted personnel. He and his wife, Sandy, reside in the greater Seattle area near Joint Base Lewis-McChord.

Command Sergeant Major (ret.) Christopher Greca



Army Command Sergeant Major Chris Greca retired from the U.S. Army in 2017 after a distinguished 31-year military career. During his service to our Nation, he served as a top enlisted leader at multiple levels of command in Army and Joint assignments during peace and war. He culminated his career as the Command Senior Enlisted Leader for U.S. Central Command, consisting of over 75,000 service members responsible for advancing U.S. national security interests across the Middle East. Lastly, he collaborates across the commercial sector to develop enhanced medical devices for military members and veterans suffering from spinal cord injury.
