**EMORY HEALTHCARE** is the largest, most comprehensive health system in Georgia and includes The Emory Clinic, Emory-Children's Center, Emory University Hospital, Emory University Hospital Midtown, Emory Johns Creek Hospital, Wesley Woods Center, Emory University Orthopaedics & Spine Hospital and the jointly owned Emory-Adventist Hospital.

Emory Specialty Associates, a component of **EMORY HEALTHCARE**, is a physician group practice organization that includes divisions of primary care, cardiology, anesthesiology, pathology and emergency medicine, as well as Emory Clark-Holder Clinic, a multispecialty group serving LaGrange, Ga.

In conjunction with Air Methods Corporation, Emory provides medical oversight for four Emory Flight helicopters based at centers in Atlanta, Griffin, Jefferson and Cartersville that serve Georgia and surrounding states. The helicopters are on 24-hour standby to lift critically ill patients to the closest appropriate hospital.

The components of **EMORY HEALTHCARE** provide a full continuum of care and serve a wide range of health care needs.

**EMORY HEALTHCARE** includes:

- **The Emory Clinic, Inc.**

The largest, most comprehensive group practice in Georgia, The Emory Clinic includes 1,400 physicians, nurse clinicians and physician assistants. Clinic facilities on the Emory University campus include multispecialty and primary care sites, cancer care at Winship Cancer Institute of Emory University and geriatric outpatient care at Wesley Woods. Clinic physicians practice at numerous sites throughout metro Atlanta, including Emory Midtown (12 specialties), Executive Park (orthopaedics), Decatur, DeKalb Medical Center, Dunwoody, Emory Eastside, Emory Johns Creek, Flat Shoals Parkway, Hillandale, Perimeter, Rockdale, Smyrna, Sugarloaf and Well-Star Kennestone. In addition to sites throughout metro Atlanta, the Clinic operates heart and vascular sites throughout the state. The Clinic also manages Emory Specialty Associates.

- **Emory-Children’s Center**

The largest pediatric multispecialty group practice in Georgia, Emory-Children’s Center (ECC) is a joint venture between Emory and Children’s Healthcare of Atlanta. It comprises 237 Emory University School of Medicine faculty members involved in pediatric clinical services, teaching, research and child advocacy. In addition to Children’s Healthcare (at Egleston, Scottish Rite and Hughes Spalding), ECC provides specialty pediatric care at Emory University Hospital Midtown, Grady Memorial Hospital and pediatric clinics on Emory’s campus.

- **Emory University Hospital**

A 579-bed adult, tertiary care facility, Emory University Hospital is staffed by 1,093 Emory University School of Medicine faculty members. It includes a 20-bed psychiatric facility, 102 ICU beds, a 56-bed rehabilitation center and a nine-bed clinical research center supported by the NIH. The hospital has been long known for cardiology, cardiac surgery, orthopaedics, oncology and neurology/ neurosurgery and includes one of the region’s most comprehensive multiple-organ and tissue transplantation centers. The hospital was named in 11 of 16 specialties ranked by *U.S. News & World Report* in 2009. For the 11th year in a row, members of the Atlanta community named the hospital as the National Research Corporation’s (NRC) Consumer Choice Award winner.

- **Emory University Hospital Midtown**

Emory University Hospital Midtown, formerly known as Emory Crawford Long Hospital, is a 511-bed tertiary care facility staffed by 947 Emory medical faculty members and 537 private physicians. Medical services include 56 intensive care beds, a level III neonatal intensive care unit and four hyperbaric oxygen units. The hospital’s case mix index (a measure of the complexity of illness treated) is higher than that of most community hospitals. It is well known for services in cardiology, cardiac surgery, gastroenterology, neurosurgery, cancer care and emergency medicine. Women’s services include prenatal and postnatal education, bone density testing, mammography and obstetrics, with a specialization in high-risk pregnancy.



- **Wesley Woods Center**

This geriatric center includes Wesley Woods Hospital, a 100-bed geriatric specialty facility. Founded by the United Methodist Church and Emory University, Wesley Woods Center serves more than 30,000 elderly and chronically ill patients each year. In addition to the hospital and a 25-bed inpatient hospice service, Wesley Woods has an outpatient primary care clinic, a 250-bed skilled nursing care facility (Budd Terrace) and a 201-unit residential retirement facility (Wesley Woods Towers), with one 18-unit floor dedicated to personal care. Wesley Woods is well known for its programs for depression, sleep disorders, rehabilitation, Alzheimer’s disease, Parkinson’s disease and Huntington’s disease.

- **Emory University Orthopaedics & Spine Hospital**

An extension of Emory University Hospital’s acute care services, the recently opened Emory University Orthopaedics & Spine Hospital is located six miles east of the university campus. The facility has 120 licensed beds and six operating rooms. It provides medical and surgical care for orthopaedic and spine patients as well as general acute care for orthopaedic and spine patients with nonsurgical needs.

- **Emory Johns Creek Hospital**

Located in the north metro area, Emory Johns Creek Hospital is a 110-bed facility staffed by 624 Emory and community physicians. Services include emergency care, digital imaging, a birth center with level III neonatal intensive care, a bariatric center, intensive care, advanced cardiac care and women's services.

- **Emory-Adventist Hospital at Smyrna**

As part of its commitment to community care, Emory jointly owns Emory-Adventist Hospital with Adventist Health System. Located in Smyrna, Ga., this hospital has 88 acute care beds and is staffed by more than 175 physicians.

- Children's Healthcare of Atlanta
  - Children's at Egleston (Emory campus), a 255-bed facility staffed by 237 Emory physicians.
  - Children's at Hughes Spalding (Grady Memorial Hospital campus), a 24-bed facility 90 percent staffed by Emory physicians and 10 percent staffed by Morehouse School of Medicine physicians.
  - Many Emory pediatric faculty members also teach and have admitting privileges at Children's at Scottish Rite, a 250-bed facility in north Atlanta.
- Atlanta Veterans Affairs Medical Center, a health care facility with 165 hospital beds and 100 nursing home beds that is staffed by 237 Emory physicians.

### **Affiliates for Patient Care, Teaching and Research**

Emory University School of Medicine faculty also provide care, much of it highly specialized, through long standing affiliations with the following:

- Grady Memorial Hospital, a 953-bed facility that is 85 percent staffed by Emory physicians (320 full-time equivalent physicians and 374 residents) and 15 percent staffed by Morehouse School of Medicine physicians.
