

Amounts Generally Billed (AGB) Calculation Summary

Updated August 31, 2025

Amount Generally Billed (AGB) is the amount generally billed for emergency or other medically necessary care to individuals who have insurance covering such care, determined in accordance with federal regulations at 26 CFR § 1.501(r)-5(b).

Emory Healthcare calculates the Amounts Generally Billed (AGB) for each hospital utilizing the “look-back” method. Using the “look-back method,” the AGB is derived by dividing the sum of all claims for services provided in the relevant period allowed by Medicare fee-for-service and all private insurance, including patient portions (whether the amounts were paid or not), by the gross charges for such medically necessary services. The relevant period for each year is defined as the 12-month period beginning September 1 and ending August 31.

The Hospital-Specific AGB Percentage shall be calculated for the most recent fiscal year. Each Hospital-Specific AGB Percentage will be effective until the next annual calculation of the Hospital-Specific AGB Percentage. The calculation of the Hospital-Specific AGB Percentage for each Hospital shall comply with the “look-back method.”
