Acupuncture Therapy in a Group Setting for Chronic Pain

KEY POINTS:

- The American College of Physicians recommends acupuncture as 1st line treatment for low back pain
- Acupuncture has been effective for migraines, TMJ disorders, neck and shoulder pain, knee arthritis
 - This has been done effectively in group settings
- Acupuncture has also been used to help treat depression
- Formalized auricular acupuncture was given in a group setting for treatment of substance use disorder

WHAT THIS MEANS FOR YOU: Acupunture therapy is a great way to treat multiple types of pain conditions. It is a safe pain treatment that can be used in combination with other treatment plans and has minimal side effects.

Comparative pain reduction of oral nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs and opioids for knee osteoarthritis: systematic analytic review

KEY POINTS:

- Randomized controlled trials(RCT)
 8-52 weeks duration involving knee osteoarthritis were reviewed
- Studies involving NSAID's (celecoxib, diclofenac, naproxen, piroxicam) and opioids (tramadol, hydromorphone, oxycodone) were evaluated for efficacy
- Western Ontario and McMaster Universities Osteoarthritis Pain subscale (WOMAC) 0-100 used
- Pain reduction was as follows:
 - o NSAIDs 18 points
 - Tramadol 18 points
 - o Potent opioids 19 points

WHAT THIS MEANS FOR YOU: Strong opioids such as oxycodone and hydromorphone are no better than NSAIDs such as naproxen for relief of arthritis knee pain.

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Effect of α -lipoic acid on symptoms and quality of life in patients with painful diabetic neuropathy

KEY POINTS

- α-lipoic acid (ALA) is a naturally occurring antioxidant that has been used to treat neuropathic pain
- Diabetic peripheral neuropathy is a very painful condition and is associated with older age, long standing diabetes, poor glucose control and high blood pressure
- 72 patients with painful diabetic neuropathy were treated with ALA 600mg daily for 40 days
- Significant reduction in symptoms (neuropathy symptom and neuropathy questionnaire scores).
- Significant reduction in brief pain inventory (BPI) and pain interference scores
- 50% of patients rated their health as 'very much better' or 'much better'
- Fasting triglycerides were lower
- There were no adverse events
