

This checklist details what to expect after your transplant while in the hospital. All items should be addressed before discharge.

x	Things to be Done	Notes
	Receive your teaching packet	Please thoroughly review this packet. It contains important information about what you should expect after your transplant.
	Speak with the Social Worker to verify your post-transplant support plan	Forms and plans for your care after you leave the hospital should be in place.
	Verify your Referring Provider and Primary Care Physician (PCP)	Tell your Transplant Coordinator of any changes.
	Register to Emory's Patient Portal	Please notify the Administrative Representative from the Transplant Clinic at (855)366-7989 if you need to sign up for the Portal or a demonstration on how to use it.
	Learn the medications you will take at home after transplant ("What, how much, and when am I taking?")	When you leave the hospital, transplant medications are ordered electronically. Ask for details on how this should be done.
	Receive your discharge medications and any necessary prescriptions	The Pharmacy delivers the first fill of your transplant medication to you on 6T.
	Your 1 st follow up appointment is with an Emory transplant surgeon. Emory Transplant Clinic 1365 Clifton Road NE, Clinic B Building, 6 th Floor, Atlanta, GA, 30322 (855)366-7989	Your Transplant Coordinator will provide this information. You can see this and other appointments in the Emory Patient Portal.
