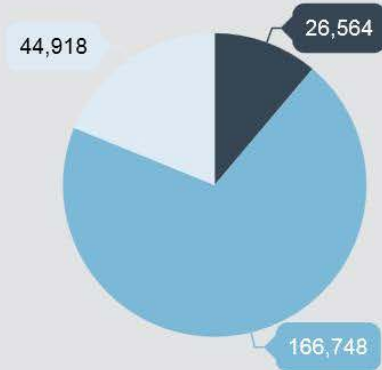

Who we are

Emory University Hospital is known for services in cardiology, cardiac surgery, oncology, neurosurgery and orthopaedics. The hospital is the nation's fifth busiest solid organ transplant center.

Emory University Hospital has 733 beds, including 93 ICU beds and a Serious Communicable Diseases Unit where the first Ebola patients in the United States were treated.
