## Emory University Hospital opens new pedestrian bridge to hospital tower

Monday, February 20, 2017, a proud group of Emory Healthcare employees, physicians and patient/family advisors were the first ones to cross the new Emory University Hospital pedestrian bridge that spans Clifton Road to the new hospital tower.

"We thank all of our employees, faculty and patient and family advisors who have contributed countless hours into the development, design and oversight of our hospital expansion project," says Bryce Gartland, MD, CEO of Emory University Hospital. "Their dedication, talent and vision are the driving forces behind the new hospital tower at Emory University Hospital and throughout Emory Healthcare."

The bridge concourse not only connects the current Emory University Hospital to the new building, it also connects to Emory Clinic Buildings A and B, and to the Winship Cancer Institute of Emory University.

The new 450,000-square-foot, \$400 million state-of-the-art hospital tower, across Clifton Road from the current hospital, will allow for an expansion of services and expert care, while creating an integrated and spacious environment for patients and their families. The

hospital addition, comprising 232 patient beds, including 40 critical care beds, will open its doors to patients later this year.

"The bridge opening is the latest of many milestones we will see as we move toward the opening of the new hospital tower," says David Pugh, vice president for Facility and Space Design for Emory Healthcare.



The old bridge demolition began Friday evening, February 24, after rush hour and completed Sunday evening, February 26.



## Clifton Streetscape update

Emory is in the midst of road and streetscape enhancements that will improve the patient experience at Emory Healthcare and provide enhanced access for thousands of Emory University and Emory Healthcare staff, students, faculty, patients and visitors who travel on Clifton Road each day.

As the new hospital tower for Emory University Hospital nears completion, there will be a series of improvements to the streets, sidewalks, landscaping and access points on Clifton Road between Haygood and North Decatur Road.

Street work is currently focused along Clifton Road, planting trees in the medians, as well as repairing sidewalks, and a new storm water structure was installed on Healthgate Drive. Georgia Power has finished the installation of light poles and crews are installing the light fixtures. Milling and roadway repairs are ongoing in the late evenings, so expect some traffic disruptions. Also, due to the warmer temperatures, testing of the newly installed irrigation system could begin earlier than scheduled.

## EUH Hospital Tower Project Timeline

Our Hospital Tower planning is making excellent progress, thanks to the outstanding work of our exceptional teams.



Due to some unexpected construction delays, which often occur with large, complex projects such as this one, we have revised the Hospital Tower timeline to ensure our new building meets the needs of our patients, staff and physicians.

While this affects our move and transition dates, it also provides us with additional time to plan and prepare. We will continue working to expedite key projects that impact staff, physicians, patients and visitors, such as completion of the bridges and valet drop-off area. The new timeline is as follows:

<b>September 17, 2017</b>	Level 6 – Solid Organ Transplant (kidney, liver and pancreas)
<b>October 28, 2017</b>	Level 5 North – Critical Care Level 9 – Bone Marrow Transplant
<b>October 29, 2017</b>	Level 8 – Hematology and Medical Oncology

- Flooring and cabinetry installation on top levels.
- Sidewalk and landscaping around new tower.
- Installation of kitchen equipment.
- Demolition of the pedestrian bridge that connects Clinic A to the Lowergate parking deck.
